

## HOW TO ORGANIZE YOUR ART NOTEBOOK:

- Page #1: Title page (provided by Mrs. Logg).
- Page #2: Homework 1
- Page #3: Homework 2
- Page #4: Homework 3
- Page #5: Homework 4
- Page #6: Vocabulary List, plus 20 sheets of lined notebook paper.
- Journal page (the journal page is provided by Mrs. Logg), plus 15 sheets of lined notebook paper.
- Fasten all into a duo-tang style notebook folder (with fasteners).

## ART NOTEBOOK FORMAT AND GRADING CRITERIA

ART NOTEBOOKS MUST BE NEAT, CLEAN, AND ORGANIZED. EACH OF THE ITEMS BELOW IS REQUIRED, IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

1. Title page
  - Including full name, grade, and homeroom: (first page in notebook)
2. Homework, listed and up-to-date
  - HW is given during each class.
3. Vocabulary, listed and up-to-date
  - Vocabulary is given during each class.
  - 20 sheets of lined notebook paper
4. Journal Page (provided by Mrs. Logg.)
5. Six journal entries (These are assigned in-class.)
  - Journal entries must be dated, labeled, and consist of at least 5 sentences each (5-sentence minimum)
  - 15 sheets of lined notebook paper
6. Homework fastened neatly in the back of the notebook

❖ *All pages must be neatly fastened into a duo-tang style notebook folder (with fasteners).*

❖ *Students are responsible for bringing their art notebook to every class; failure to do so will result in point deductions to the art notebook grade.*

## JOURNAL:

*The art journals are used as a personal critique to foster artistic creativity; this is a written reflection of your artwork.*
